STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

ME Support NI is a registered charity number N100262

The committee consists of 7 members who meet at least twice per year and are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charity.

All members of the committee are elected from and by the membership and hold office until the close of the next Annual General Meeting, where they can be reelected. The Chair is chosen from within the Committee and remains in office for not more than three consecutive years, unless 2 thirds of the full committee vote in favour of the person being re-elected as Chairperson. All Committee members are volunteers who have either got ME or are affected by people with ME.

OBJECTIVES

ME Support NI provide information, support and practical advice for people (including children), families and carers affected by M.E (Mylagic Encephalomyelitis). We aim to improve the lived experience of those children, young people and adults affected by this devastating neurological illness by lobbying for services which are underpinned by expert knowledge and an understanding of M.E.

FUNDRAISING

This year Michael McDaid, ran the Derry Walled City Marathon, raising a massive £5,623.61 for ME Support NI. This is an outstanding achievement for one individual to have raised and will allow us to continue our work. A special bequest was made by Michael's brother to donate some of the funds to Biomedical Research. To date we have made a donation of £1000 to ME Research UK.

COLLECTION TINS:

We have received donations from collection tins at the Falls Leisure Centre and Colin Harbinson, The Meat Joint. We are very grateful for this continuing support throughout the year.

DONATIONS RECIEVED:

We have received several donations from individuals which we are extremely grateful for as every penny is needed to continue the support.

One of our members Joan Burnison, undertook a fundraising initiative herself this year, by knitting some children's handbags to sell to raise funds for the group. We cannot commend her enough for this, especially as we realise the impact this work will have had on her health.

This year we also received a donation from Ballymacnab Choir, Armagh, who raised some funds for us by selling CD's they had created.



ONE TO ONE SUPPORT

We were also able to assist member with advice regarding disability and employment.

We assisted members with drafting letters for different issues.

On top of this we were able to provided emotional support to other individuals who lived outside the Greater Belfast area, and were able to put them in touch with each other so that they could provide support to each other closer to their home.

Our committee member Anne, who is a gualified social worker and fellow sufferer of M.E. continues to provide practical emotional and social care support to approximately fifty M.E sufferers and their families. My previous experience as a social worker in physical disability continues to provide me with a strong and informed base to work from. The nature of new referrals remains the same requiring information and support. Also majority of people are requesting referral to social services and various multi disciplinaries to ensure that appropriate care package is put in place. Finally most of M.E sufferers are asking for advice with regards different benefits especially DLA and ESA. Over the past year I have built up a core group of twenty M.E sufferers and their carers who are looking and needing constant and ongoing support. There has been a steady increase in number of suicidal sufferers needing ongoing support. Also there has been noticeable increase in number of people asking for help and advice with regards appeals system. This all reflects growing needs of M.E sufferers and carers and difficulties they are facing in attempting to get the help that they need and are entitled to in trying to manage their illness.

Steering group for ME/Fibromyalgia

In November we were approached by the Patient Client Council to form a Steering group for ME/Fibromyalgia. Antoinette, Darren and Anne (committee members) have attended monthly meetings and are working towards organising and participating in Workshops for Professionals on ME/Fibromyalgia in February 2014.



FUTURE PLANS & PROSPECTS

1. Steering Group ME/Fibromyalgia

We will continue to work in partnership with the Patient Client Council. We will participate in Invisible ME, a workshop for professionals planned February 2015. We will continue holding monthly meeting with the Patient Client Council in the coming year.

2. Media planned in January 2015

Television programme with NVTV including Chairperson of ME Support NI and 3 of our members, David Maloney, a carer, Lorna Bryson, a young person with ME and Dr Pamela Bell, Pain Alliance.

3. Shine a light campaign for ME

As last years campaign was so successful, we will continue to see how many buildings we can get lit blue for ME Awareness Day, May 12th 2015. We will also try to improve media coverage for this campaign.
